History:

St. Leo Catholic School is a vital part of St. Leo the Great Parish, and is guided by our pastor, Father Brian Cook. Fr. Cook celebrates Mass with the students on Friday morning. To the joy of the children, Fr. Cook brings a special item or two or three in a bag to illustrate the Gospel stories of the day. Father and his dogs, Daisy and Marigold, also visit our classrooms.

The Benedictine Order founded Belmont Abbey, a Benedictine College, to promote the Catholic faith in western North Carolina, and the Benedictine Fathers began mission work in Forsyth County in 1886. In 1942, St. Leo Parish was transferred from the charge of the Benedictine Order to the Diocese of Raleigh, and its first pastor, Michael J. Begley, was appointed. The following year, Father Begley (later Bishop Begley, first Bishop of the Diocese of Charlotte) welcomed the Sisters of St. Joseph from Chestnut Hill, Pennsylvania. Having opened a convent on Georgia Avenue, the sisters first taught only Religion, Art, and Piano, but in 1949 they opened the Villa Maria Anna Academy, the first Catholic grammar school in Winston-Salem, NC. In 1953, with the purchase of property next to St. Leo the Great Catholic Church, St. Leo Catholic School was born. (The Villa continued to operate as a high school, the forerunner of Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School, currently located in Kernersville.).

For more than sixty years, St. Leo Catholic School has educated thousands of young people in their faith, and in the skills they need to function in secular society. In 2005, St. Leo was the first Catholic school in the Charlotte diocese to be awarded the status of Blue Ribbon School by the National U.S. Department of Education, an annual recognition of academic excellence granted to only 50 non-public schools. In 2013, <u>Today's Catholic Teacher</u> magazine recognized St. Leo as "A School of Innovation" Awardee. In the spring of 2015 with other diocesan schools, St. Leo Catholic School was recommended for continuing accreditation through the SACS CASI AdvancED organization.

For over sixty years through the efforts and partnership of dedicated administration, parents, teachers, and staff, St. Leo Catholic School is a place where students can learn to be active members of their faith community and responsible citizens of the world.

School Year

The St. Leo Catholic School year is divided into trimesters. Regular communication between home and school includes email, telephone, progress reports, and parent conferences.

- K-8: The school day begins at 8:00 am until 3:00 pm. Before-School Care is available, beginning at 7:15am. An After School Care program is offered from 3:00 pm until 6 pm on full school days. There is a fee for these programs.
- 4 year old Prekindergarten 8:30 –11:30am, Lunch Bunch is designed for students enrolled in our Prekindergarten class, this option provides an extended hour of school for students to have lunch and engage in social play activities with their peers. It is offered on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm.

Learn:

We started our educational journey in August. Two academic programs were introduced this year:

ROAR (review, Organization, Arts, Recreation): A period provided for middle school students to explore flexible options including subject review, support for assignments and organization, special interest in arts and fitness, and recreational activities.

PRIDE (Preparation, Review, and Intervention for Developing Excellence): Designed to meet the academic and organizational support needs of the middle school student and their parents. Students are in a quiet, but not silent, study atmosphere with assistance from the adult supervisor. Students have access to computers for homework completion.







Before and After Care - St. Leo Catholic School is able to better meet the needs of our families by offering before and after school care. Our Before School Care program begins at 7:15am. During After School Care the students are supervised in a nurturing environment from 3pm until 6pm. Lunch **Program** - St. Leo Catholic School is able to offer an alternative to bag lunches five days a week. Students may choose from specified vendors and order on days they prefer. The menu stays the same for the year and orders are placed three times a year to correlate with the trimester schedule.
